

#### Panel Question



Since 1950 federal government has tried to plan for national emergencies, and what that looks like has changed over the years. The responsibilities for that planning are betwixt and between federal and national organizations, and structures and efforts are not aligned. What is the solution?



#### Panel Question



As we learned already during COVID-19, almost all state resource request processes do not keep pace when the number of requests, the different types of things requested, the duration of the response, and what funding would be applicable to the requests. How do we rethink resource requests processes, and what are the implications of that?



#### Panel Question



Military installations are dependent on critical infrastructure resources from their neighboring communities and the private sector. What are the authorities for local/state governments to support the resource needs of military and other federal installations (civil support to defense authorities)?



#### Panel Questions



Current resiliency grants are going out to all the states. Critical infrastructure is vastly interdependent and spans state and international boundaries. Are existing policies and funding mechanisms at federal and state levels equipped to do this type of planning? Are there enough resources to do it?
