New Federal Funding Accountability and Transparency Act Subaward Reporting Function Internal Briefing

VDEM's Requirement under 2 CFR Chapter 1, Part 170

Prime Awardees awarded a federal grant are required to file a FFATA sub-award report by the end of the month following the month in which the prime awardee awards any sub-grant equal to or greater than \$30,000. The reporting requirements are as follows:


- This requirement is for both mandatory and discretionary grants awarded on or after October 1, 2010.
- All sub-award information must be reported by the prime awardee.
- For those new Federal grants as of October 1, 2010, if the initial award is equal to or over \$30,000, reporting of sub-award and executive compensation data is required.
- If the initial award is below \$30,000 but subsequent grant modifications result in a total award equal to or over \$30,000, the award will be subject to the reporting requirements, as of the date the award exceeds \$30,000.
- If the initial award equals or exceeds \$30,000 but funding is subsequently deobligated such that the total award amount falls below \$30,000, the award continues to be subject to the reporting requirements of the Transparency Act and this Guidance.

How Information is Collected

- Primary, Alternates, and Authorized Rep Contacts are notified via email when it's time to re-certify their report (once a year). Emails are sent 11 months after their last certification (the system runs a task to check Applicants at 5am).
- If the report is not certified **after 10 days**, a **reminder email** is sent to Primary, Alternates, and Authorized Rep Contacts.
- Only one user needs to certify the information. Other users will be able to see that it has been certified.
- An enhancement is coming so that only one person will receive this notification in 2025.
