Community Impact Highlights


Pittsylvania County: Installed generators for 6 fire stations, enhancing emergency response capabilities during severe weather events.

In King George County, the River Stabilization Project has effectively strengthened riverbanks to mitigate flood risks in the area. This critical initiative comes after the county faced significant erosion and flood-related challenges, protecting essential infrastructure and residential properties.
