## (NSGP-NSS) Program Purpose

The objective of the NSGP-NSS is to provide funding for physical security enhancements and other security-related activities to nonprofit organizations that are at high risk of a terrorist attack. NSGP also seeks to integrate the preparedness activities of nonprofit organizations with broader state and local preparedness efforts.

#### **NSGP Overview: Eligibility**

#### What type of entities/organizations <u>are</u> <u>eligible</u> to apply under NSGP?

The list below is not exhaustive and only provides examples of potential eligible organizations, all of which must be nonprofits.



Houses of worship



Educational facilities



Medical facilities



Senior centers/care facilities



Community/social service



Shelters/crisis centers



Event venues



Science organizations



Camps



Museums

Eligible organizations are registered 501(c)(3) nonprofits or otherwise are organizations as described under 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) and tax-exempt under section 501(a) of the IRC.

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## Required documentation

- 1- Investment Justification (IJ)
- \*Also, Consortium Workbook for nonprofit consortia organizations
- 2- Vulnerability Assessment (VA)
- 3- Mission Statement (MS)



All documents <u>must</u> be submitted by the deadline to progress into the review and scoring process.



#### **Investment Justification**

This document will allow the applicant to share with the state and federal government why your facility is at risk, the steps to mitigate the risks, and the timeline and resources needed to accomplish this project.

- It must be filled out completely. If it is not, it will be deemed ineligible and will not be considered for review and scoring.
- It cannot be altered from its original Adobe format.
- There must be a clear connection between the risks in the Vulnerability Assessment and your project scope of work.
- The maximum amount for an individual application is \$200,000. An applicant with multiple sites may apply for up to three sites, for a maximum of \$600,000.
- Consortium applications are also eligible under the NSGP-NSS. In this
  case, an eligible entity would apply on behalf of themselves and other
  eligible entities as a subapplicant to the SAA. Consortia may apply through
  the SAA for an award totaling \$1 million.

Section IV-B: In this section, list all proposed facility hardening equipment, projects, or activities as allowable per the Authorized Equipment List (AEL), NSGP Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO), and Preparedness Grants Manual (PGM). Select the AEL number and title, list the vulnerability the equipment/project/activity addresses, and enter the estimated funding requested (round up to the nearest dollar).

#### **Equipment List**

- Equipment costs are allowed under this program only as described in this funding notice and the <u>Preparedness Grants Manual</u>.
- Allowable costs are focused on facility hardening and physical security enhancements. Funding can be used for the acquisition and installation of security equipment on real property (including buildings and improvements) owned or leased by the nonprofit organization, specifically in prevention of and/or protection against the risk of a terrorist or other extremist attack. This equipment is **limited to select items** on the <u>Authorized Equipment List (AEL)</u>. You will find the complete list in the NOFO under Equipment.



#### **Equipment List (Ineligible)**

**G. UNALLOWABLE COSTS -** The following projects and costs are considered **ineligible** for award consideration:

- Organization costs, and operational overtime costs;
- Hiring of public safety personnel;
- General-use expenditures;
- Overtime and backfill;
- •Initiatives that do not address the implementation of programs/initiatives to build prevention and protection-focused capabilities directed at identified facilities and/or the surrounding communities;
- The development of risk/vulnerability assessment models;
- •Initiatives that fund risk or vulnerability security assessments or the development of the IJ;
- •Initiatives in which federal agencies are the beneficiary or that enhance federal property;
- Initiatives which study technology development;
- Proof-of-concept initiatives;
- •Initiatives that duplicate capabilities being provided by the Federal Government;
- Organizational operating expenses;
- •Reimbursement of pre-award security expenses (see Section D.12.b);
- •Cameras for license plate readers/license plate reader software;
- Cameras for facial recognition software;
- •Weapons or weapons-related training; and
- Knox boxes.

#### **Review of Part V. MILESTONES**

Start dates should reflect the start of the associated key activities and end dates should reflect when the milestone event will occur. Milestones should reflect considerations to Environmental Planning and Historic Preservation reviews when applicable. (10 milestones maximum)

#### **Projected Timeline**

FEMA announcement of awards by May 10, 2025

VDEM announcement of awardees by July 31, 2025

Sub awardee application submission in VDEM Grants System (~60 days) by September 30, 2025

EHP (Environmental Planning & Historical Review) Start Date should be listed within 14 days of VDEM grant staff receiving completed documentation.

Completion Date should be listed 3-6 months after the Start Date. This is subject to take longer depending upon the level of review required.

Each Key Activity dates should progress after the Completion Date

#### **Vulnerability Assessment**



#### **Identify risk(s)**

Department of Homeland Security defines risk as the product of three principal variables: Threat, Vulnerability, and Consequence.



## **UEI# (Unique Entity Identifier)**





All entities wishing to do business with the federal government must have a unique entity identifier (UEI). The UEI number is issued by the SAM system. Requesting a UEI using SAM.gov is straightforward; the link can be found at <a href="https://sam.gov/content/entity-">https://sam.gov/content/entity-</a>

registration. Note that subrecipients do not need to have a valid UEI at the time of application but must have a valid UEI in order to receive a subaward.

#### **Application Submission**

#### **Applicants in the Hampton Roads Designated Urban Area**

The following information and instructions are for nonprofit applicants located within the Hampton Roads Urban Area: City of Chesapeake, City of Franklin, Gloucester County, City of Hampton, Isle of Wight County, James City County, City of Newport News, City of Norfolk, City of Poquoson, City of Portsmouth, Southampton County, City of Suffolk, Surry County, City of Virginia Beach, City of Williamsburg, and York County.

Applicants must submit their NSGP-NSS-UA applications no later than **Friday**, **December 13**, **2024**, **5:00 PM EDT** through the VDEM application portal <u>here</u>. After review by the Urban Area Working Group, projects will be submitted to the Virginia Department of Emergency Management, the State Administrative Agent (SAA) for submission to FEMA.

Applications must use the following file naming convention: "NSGP\_NSS\_UA\_ VA\_HR\_Your Nonprofit Name"

Consortium applications must use the following convention for the NSGP-NSS-UA: "NSGP\_NSS\_UA\_C\_VA\_UA\_Consortium Lead Name"



#### **Application Submission**

#### **Applicants in the National Capital Region Designated Urban Area**

The following information and instructions are for nonprofit applicants located within the National Capital Region Urban Area (NCR) which includes Arlington, Fairfax, Loudoun and Prince William Counties and the City of Alexandria in Virginia.

Applicants must submit their applications no later than **Friday, January 3, 2025**, **at 11:59:59 PM EDT** to the District of Columbia Homeland Security and Emergency Management Agency (DC HSEMA), which is the State Administrative Agent (SAA) for this grant in this region.

Submit applications by email to ncr.saa@dc.gov and Cembrye.ross@dc.gov. Do not submit to FEMA or Grants.gov. Capital Region NSGP grant information can be found <a href="https://example.com/here">here</a> at the DC HSEMA website.



#### **Application Submission**

#### Virginia Applicants in Areas Other Than Designated Urban Areas

Any nonprofit applicant in Virginia (S) that is not located within either the Hampton Roads(HR) or the National Capital Region (NCR) designated urban areas will submit their applications to the SAA Virginia Department of Emergency Management (VDEM).

Applicants must submit their applications no later than Friday, December 13, 2024, at 5:00 PM EDT to the Virginia Department of Emergency Management.

Submit applications through the VDEM application.

Applications must use the following file naming convention: "NSGP\_NSS\_**S**\_VA\_Your Nonprofit Name"

Consortium applications must use the following convention for the NSGP-NSS-S: "NSGP-NSS\_S\_C\_VA\_Consortium Lead Name"
